

Currituck County 4-H Clubs

Being a member of a 4-H club helps young people grow and develop by providing learning opportunities in a hands-on environment under the guidance of trained 4-H volunteers.

Club volunteers, along with members develop a club calendar that outlines age appropriate educational and social activities that will occur during the year. 4-H clubs also allow members to develop leadership skills by participating in the electoral process and holding officer positions. Not only are members learning simple parliamentary procedure and flag etiquette, they are also enhancing their self esteem. Members of a community club have diverse interests and decide as a group what kind of programming and projects they will participate in during the year.

<u>Sand Spurs</u>- is a horse special interest club. Youth compete in horse art, photography, judging, showing, and general horse care. Meetings are held at the NC Cooperative Extension Office in Barco. Members are ages 9 and 18. Leaders: Patricia Rippin

<u>Seeking Success</u> - is a horse project club that meets at the NC Cooperative Extension office in Barco or the Moyock Public Library. <u>Wolfpack</u> - is a horse project club. Members meet at the leader's home in Shawboro. Members of the club learn equine science and horsemanship skills. Leaders: Nora Tarpley, Deb Pawlin

<u>The Currituck Sharp Shooters</u> - This 4-H club is a special interest club. Their specific program area is shooting sports. Some of their activities include gun safety and target shooting. Their club meetings are held at the Academi Training Center. Club members are ages 9 to 18.

<u>Fancy Feathers</u> - This 4-H club is also a special interest club. Their specific program area is on chickens and other yard birds.
